Revitalising Club Burwood RSL

Club Burwood RSL has been a hub of cultural activity for locals and visitors alike for over 100 years. The Club has always evolved with the times and is investigating how to best serve its patrons and the community in a new revitalised space.

The Club is seeking to deliver an iconic club complex in the Burwood Town Centre. This dynamic new community space will include cafes and restaurants, bars and lounges, large entertainment spaces, gaming, a health and fitness centre, conference and event facilities.

The development of Club Burwood RSL will contribute to important economic recovery efforts for both the hospitality and construction industries after the COVID-19 period ends, as well as creating a new modern social hub for the local district.

A community update on Club Burwood RSL's plans

In 2017 Club Burwood RSL lodged a Concept Development Application (DA85/2017) which was approved on 25 February 2019 by the Sydney Eastern Planning Panel.

Since gaining this approval Club Burwood RSL has acquired 59-63 Shaftesbury Road, which is now proposed to be incorporated into the development site, enabling solutions for traffic management and improved design outcomes for the public domain.

Club Burwood RSL is required to modify the Concept Development Application. This will provide for future registered club uses, food and beverage outlets, rooftop bar, health, leisure and lifestyle centre, swimming pool and conference facilities within the expanded site.

In addition, a DA will be submitted for a 3-4 storey Club building containing a registered club with a variety of vibrant food outlets, themed bars, entertainment lounge, theatre, indoor sports, fitness centre, sports bar and micro-brewery, a stateof-the-art event centre and gaming facilities.

Design

A key feature of the proposal is to create co-habitable, walkable streets to improve pedestrian and cycling connections for residents.

A Porte cochere, which is a covered entrance large enough for vehicles, will be built on the corner of Marmaduke and Deane Streets to provide separation of pedestrian and vehicular movements, facilitating safe passages and providing a location for public art.

Improved traffic flow

Club Burwood RSL understands that managing traffic and parking is important to the community. Care has been taken to provide optimal traffic flow and enable safe pedestrian movement around the site. Vehicular access for parking via Shaftesbury Road and from Deane Street.

Approximately 1,250 parking spaces in new six level basement car park.

Access via Marmaduke Street for delivery and waste service vehicles located in the basement space to decrease noise and any potential disruption for near neighbours.

Widening of George Street, Deane Street and part of Shaftesbury Road to improve traffic movements. New landscaped footpath to enhance the public domain and pedestrian experience of the precinct.

New traffic lights at the George Street & Shaftesbury Road intersection to improve traffic flows and pedestrian safety.

Early 2020

Club Burwood revised design and site plans to include 59-63 Shaftesbury Road.

Mid 2020

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Community consultation for Club Burwood amended Concept DA and Podium DA.

Two Development Applications lodged (one for changes to the approved concept plans and one for the Podium with Burwood Council.

Mid-late 2020

Revised Concept and Podium DA's will be on public exhibition.

Early-Mid 2021

Expected determination from Sydney Eastern City Planning Panel.
